

THE GLOBAL BURDEN OF LIVER CANCER

Liver cancer is the **6th most common cancer** and the **3rd leading cause of cancer death** worldwide, with an estimated **841,000 new cases** and nearly **782,000 deaths** in 2018 alone.¹

In 2019, an estimated **42,000** adults in the United States were diagnosed with liver cancer³



Men are **three times more likely** to get liver cancer⁴

More than **80%** of liver cancer cases happen in less developed countries, with the most new cases in Asia and Africa⁵
